1) Welcome and Introductions

2) Adoption of the Agenda

The agenda was approved with the additional topic – Policy Handbook.

3) Review and Approval of September 21st 2010 minutes

Minutes were reviewed and adopted as is.

4) Cogito Guest Teacher Presentation

A new feature added to the meeting Cogito is teacher presentations to the parent committee. Each Steering Committee meeting a Cogito teacher is invited to present to the group a more in-depth look into the Cogito classroom for their grade/subject. This provides an opportunity for parents to get an insight into the program in other grades or subjects; plus it provides for further open communication between parents and teachers – especially teachers that parents may be interacting with in future grades.

Our first Guest Teacher Presenter was Mr. Kondruk. Mr. Kondruk took the group to his class room and talked about some of the topics covered by Cogito grade 7 and 8 science and math, at times focusing on some of the differences for these subjects specific to the Cogito program. The presentation was both informative and entertaining - Thank you Mr. Kondruk.

5) Uniform Sub-Committee Update

A uniform sub-committee meeting was held October 19th at 6:30pm to review the information and proposals issued by RJ McCarthy and TopMarks. After deliberation on the merits and challenges with both vendors a vote was held and a unanimous decision to proceed with RJ McCarthy as the Cogito uniform supplier to Elmer S. Gish School. Some key reasons sighted for this decision include:

- Cost generally the overall cost is less with RJ McCarthy (although some items are more whereas some items are considerably less – costs will vary depending on quantity and number of items purchased)
- Quality garments from RJ McCarthy are of a higher quality than TopMarks
- Buying Experience Purchasing options are more flexible through RJ McCarthy than TopMarks. Plans may be in the works to establish an onsite (in school) parent

- managed "store". The details and viability of which will be investigated at the next Uniform Sub-committee meeting.
- Uniform options RJ McCarthy had available more options in sizes and items than TopMarks. RJ McCarthy sizing to suite small children up to adult sizes. In addition the are options and sizes for garments (e.g. Hoodies) available to Junior High students.
- St. Albert Cogito Tartan RJ McCarthy was able to re-produce the St. Albert Cogito tartan.

A question was raised with regards to opportunities to make changes to the uniform. This topic was briefly discussed. It was agreed that: any changes would be small; and further discussion on this would be tabled at the next Uniform Sub-Committee meeting.

5) Principal's Report

a) Website

Paul Kane high school was unable to find a student from their Career Technologies Studies to help with the building of the St. Albert Cogito Website. An advertisement will be placed in the school newsletter for a person with the time and ability to build the website.

Uniform Supplies Update

Top Marks uniform supplier was contacted regarding the programs decision to go with another supplier. Top Marks indicated that the Cogito program at Gish is required to pay for some existing uniform material purchases. The new uniform supplier, R.J. McCarthy, will buy the existing material from Top Marks.

Free Standing Cogito Website

A meeting was held with Sam Pratoompron, web developer, regarding the design and setup of the Cogito website. Further sessions will be help with Mr. Pratoompron regarding design and schedule for the website.

Cogito Writing Initiative K-9

Mrs. Hunter has coordinated a program wide Cogito Writing Initiative, Kindergarten to Grade 9 Progressive Writing Analysis Strategy. Writing assignments are done once per term at all grade levels. Rubrics will be followed with specific writing prompts.

Baking Club

Two Cogito grade 4 students submitted a proposal to start a baking club in our school. Miss Chute, our Home Economics and grade 7/8 Cogito Teacher is supervising the club. The club is to meet every Tuesday at lunch.

Chess Club

The grade 6 Cogito teacher, Mr. Gibson, has started a Chess Club. Presently there are 32 members from division II grades meeting every Monday at lunch in room 161.

7a) Policy Handbook

Proposed homework revisions were presented. Further revisions were requested to promote consistency in messaging, particularly in Junior High.

7b) Noon Hour Activities

Existing activities seem to be mostly for Division II. A proposal was made to have some activities (eg. a play, or singing) for the younger grades

6) Uniform Supplier Update

- A representative from Neat Uniforms (by RJ McCarthy)TM Sam Khimani was in attendance as a meet and greet. Sam will be the primary uniform vendor contact to our school. Sam welcomes feedback and questions from parents (phone #1-800-668-8261 ext 207).
- A uniform closet in the school has been established. Uniform samples will be kept in room 121 concession room. The uniforms in the closet, by design, consist of garments not in Gish colours. These garments are merely samples to used for size fitting.

- Ordering of uniforms can be made on-line, by phone or fax. (<u>www.rjmccarthly.com</u>).
- The company is unique with its social responsibility initiative. It's monitored by independent organizations focused on ethical production of clothes.
- In April/May, there is a plan for a focus week for parents to come in and order for the fall. If the child has a growth spurt, any unused items with tags on can be returned for exchange or refund.
- An article will be placed in the Cogito section of the newsletter providing more information about the uniform closet
